- Study the author's use of ellipsis in the book. What did they add to the meaning of the book?

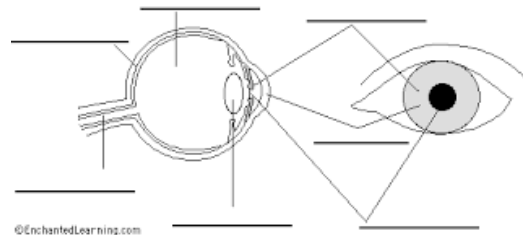
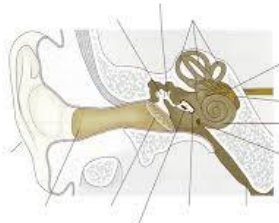
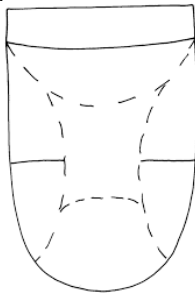
## DOK 3: Strategic Thinking
